Suri Vidyasagar College being an affiliated college of the University of Burdwan, the syllabus modification and updatation are done solely by the university. However, based on the current syallbi, the departments draw up detailed teaching plan for each of the faculty members, who then implement the teaching plan in their respective classes. This ensures timely and effective delivery of education to the incumbents. The internal assessment tests/project reports/seminars etc. are carried out regularly as per the cbcs guidelines and the marks obtained record is maintained by the departments and forwarded to the college for updation of the student evaluation process. Apart from traditional chalk and talk method of teaching, the college gives impetus to the ICT based teaching learning through use of powerpoint presentation, audio-visual support and computer laboratories. Teachers regularly take extra classes as tutorial for those students who are lagging behind or the whole class. Speaking and ICT skill enhancement of the students are encouraged through powerpoint based seminars organized for the students. The students of the Science faculty also take part in the Science model exhibition to augment practical skills to the syllabus based study.
